# Water Quality Report: Dave Scott

- Discussed lake levels, spring of 21' is the zero point. Levels dropped during drought but went up 9 inches over the winter due to snow levels.
- Secchi disk in May were 36 feet and at 20-21 foot levels now but getting worse due to algae bloom.
  Phosphorous levels are increasing and discussed the importance of cleaning out leaves on the shoreline.
- July 30<sup>th</sup> will be installing willow wattle on Prell's property
- Starry Stonewort volunteer opportunity coming up August 20th
- Aitkin Soil and Water Conservation officer Steve Hughes will be retiring and there is a party on 7/19

# AIS Report: Linda Szymanski

- Starry Stonewort is the biggest concern now, August 20<sup>th</sup> from 8-1 pm looking for volunteers to check area lakes
- Discussed concern over service providers that are in our lake and the 2 that are certified are Stevo's and FIRM. Be sure and check that whomever you have are certified.

# Fish and Wildlife Report: Zint Kics

- Explained the "Lead Free Tackle" initiative and how it impacts wildlife (loons in particular). Question asked "how can I tell if it's lead?" and Zint explained.
- Fish stocking is normally every 2 years but due to covid will not have fish survey until 2024
